

The Monroe County Medical Society is currently seeking nominations for its 2012 Edward Mott Moore Awards.

### **Award Specifics**

Recipients will receive a plaque and recognition on stage, in front of friends, family and colleagues at the MCMS Annual Meeting in May. Recipients will also receive recognition in the *The Bulletin*, the Society's physician news magazine, and on [www.mcms.org](http://www.mcms.org); and recognition in press releases to local media.

### **Who Can Make a Nomination**

Any individual or group — including professional associates, patients, and their families— may submit nominations. Nominations submitted in prior years may be resubmitted.

### **Nomination Process**

All nominations require a letter of nomination, providing details on how the nominee meets the Award criteria and an overview of nominee's achievements and a current CV or similar biographical sketch of the nominee. Newspaper clippings, copies of certificates and other relevant supporting documentation may also be helpful. The Awards Committee members receive the entire material submitted on all of the nominees.

### **Selection**

The Awards Committee reviews all nominees at their yearly meeting and recommends one candidate for the physician award and one candidate for the layperson award to the Board of Directors. The Board reviews the recommendations and, if found to represent the highest standards of the Society, approves the candidates. Approved candidates are informed by the executive director in March.

### **Award Criteria**

When determining if a person should receive or be nominated for the Edward Mott Moore Award, consideration will be given to the following criteria:

- **Length of service to the community:** This individual's contributions have been made over a significant length of service.
- **Level of results:** This individual has made an outstanding contribution to the community that is beyond the normal scope of their duties and professional responsibilities.
- **Effort:** This individual has demonstrated breadth and depth in effort and spirit.
- **Impact on patients or the profession of medicine:** This individual merits recognition for distinguished service in advancing and promoting the health and well-being of the people of our community.

The Society seeks to recognize individuals whose achievements in these criteria are outstanding, recognizing that nominees may demonstrate more strength in some criteria than in others.

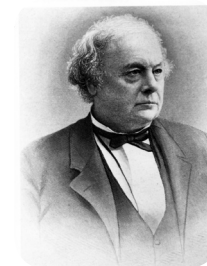

## The Edward Mott Moore Award is...

the highest honor bestowed by the Medical Society. It is presented annually to a physician and a layperson in recognition of outstanding and dedicated service to the medical profession and the community.



*Dr. Edward Mott Moore (1814–1902) was a prominent surgeon, outstanding teacher, investigator, leader and contributor to the Rochester community, where he resided. As a man of strong intellectual gifts and clear vision, Dr. Moore's abilities were soon recognized. With the title of professor of surgery, he gave lectures at medical colleges in Woodstock, VT; Berkshire, MA, Cleveland and Buffalo. He was president of the Monroe County, Central New York, and New York State Medical Societies, the American Medical Association and the American Surgical Association, and the New York State Board of Health. For nearly 50 years, he was the head of the St. Mary's Hospital staff. His activities in our community were not confined to medicine. For many years he was president of the board of trustees of the University of Rochester. Dr. Moore was instrumental in establishing the Rochester City Hospital and the Infant's Summer Hospital. His later years were devoted almost exclusively to the development of Rochester's park system.*

*Dr. Moore was devoted to the alleviation of human suffering. His influence for good in our community was quiet, constant and effective. Through this award, the Medical Society seeks to recognize those in our community who most closely emulate the service and breadth reflected in the life of Dr. Moore.*
