Dr. Mahala Schlagman is the Assistant Program Director for Health Equity in the Internal Medicine residency at URMC. She is also the Medical Director of a pilot Medical Legal Partnership with Finger Lakes Legal

Care which has been present at Strong Internal Medicine and Highland Family Medicine since 2019. Her clinical work is in primary care at Strong Internal Medicine with a particular interest in patients who have complex biopsychosocial needs.



Rebecca Russo, JD

Rebecca Russo joined Legal Assistance of Western New York, Inc. (LawNY) in 2007 as a Staff Attorney. In 2012 she formed the Finger Lakes Legal Care (FLLC) medical legal partnership, a project of LawNY, which em-

beds attorneys in healthcare settings. The project helps patients of participating practices address social determinants of health. Rebecca co-supervised LawNY's Health Law Unit for seven years, before pivoting to focus on medical legal partnership client services and program development full time in 2021. She serves as the Co-Chair of the Lawyers' Coalition for Racial and Social Justice; the CLE Committee Co-Chair of the Greater Rochester Association for Women Attorneys; and is the immediate past President of Inclusive Woods & Us.
